Explanation of Terms:

Other: Domestic animals other than dogs or cats (rabbits, turtles, guinea pigs, etc.)

Wild: Wildlife (raccoons, squirrels, bats, etc.)

Animal Control: Animals brought in my an Animal Control Officer or Police Officer

Public Stray: Stray animlas brought in by a member of the public

TNR: Feral cat accepts for TNR (Trap-Neuter-Return) to orginal location

Surrender: Animals brought in by their owners who can no longer keep them

Quarantine: Animals that are brought in for rabies observation

Owner Request (OR): Animal brought in by owner requesting euthanasia or disposal

County: Animals brought in from unincorporated area of the City

Drop: Animals that have been left at the shelter while shelter is closed

Return: Animals returned to the shelter after being adopted

Carry Over: Animals remaining at the shelter/in foster care from the previous month

Remaining: Animals remaining at the shelter/in foster care at the end of the month

RTO: Animals returned to (claimed by) their owner

Rescue: Animals transferred to another rescue/non-profit organization (including BHS) or a wildlife rehab center

Transferred: Animals transferred to another animal control agency (usually Butte County)

Released: Wildlife releasted to wild or cat TNR

*Includes stray animals brought to vet by a member of the public and euthanized/died at vet clinic
